90 Points - Dry Creek Vineyard's Cabernet is always dependable, always satisfying. Stylistically it's refined rather than rustic, with lively, bright fruit notes, medium tannins, and a generous finish. One of the most venerable producers in this part of Sonoma County (established in 1972), Dry Creek Vineyard gets it right just about every vintage.

★★★★ **Four Stars** - Full bodied, lightly oaky, and fruity (black cherry, cassis); a well balanced, moderately rich yet stylish Cabernet, with a long, lightly tannic finish.

87 Points - **"Top Value!"** - Tight and closed, dry and herbal, with a core of blackberry and black cherry that is slow to emerge. Once it does, this is supple and complex, offering tobacco and dill notes. Drink now through 2016.

88 Points - Lots of rich, extracted blackberry, cherry and currant flavors in this wine, with nuances of sweet, smoky oak and considerable spices, especially toward the finish. The distinguishing feature is the tannins.
